

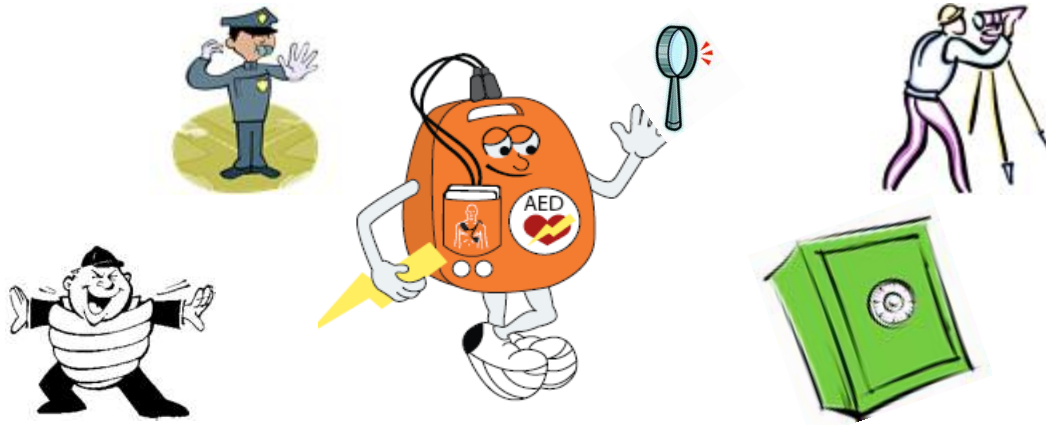

Sudden Cardiac Arrest Emergency Response 1st Step Before Approaching Patient



Determine The Scene Is Safe

Adult CPR/AED Additional Steps :

- * Check for Response – Tap & Shout
- * Phone 911 If Patient Does Not Respond
- * Open Airway
- * Check Breathing
- * If Not Breathing Normally – Give Two Breaths
- * Start CPR (30 compressions / 2 breaths)
 - * Hands Only CPR is recommended only for helping adults who have suddenly collapsed
- * Use AED as soon as it arrives
- * Follow Prompts of AED

Rescuers should follow Universal Precautions to protect themselves from Bloodborne Pathogens.

Signs of Sudden Cardiac Arrest:

- Unconscious
- Not Responding
- Not Breathing or Not Breathing Normally
- Agonal Breathing or Gasping is Not Normal Breathing
- Seizures/Convulsions may occur when patient collapses



Combat Sudden Cardiac Arrest with

- Early 911
- Early CPR
- Early Defibrillation
- Early Advanced Life Support



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
