1. Make sure the SCENE is safe	18. Keep following the AED prompts until victim starts to move or EMS takes over
2. Make sure the victim is lying on a firm, <b>FLAT</b> , surface	17. Resume the steps of CPR right after the <b>SHOCK</b> delivery
3. Tap and <b>SHOUT</b> to see if victim responds	16. Push the <b>SHOCK</b> button if the AED tells you to do so (AED may be fully automated)
4. If victim does not respond, yell for <b>HELP</b>	15. Allow the AED to check the heart <b>RHYTHM</b>
5. Phone <b>911</b>	14. Make sure no one touches the <b>VICTIM</b>
6. Get, or send someone to get the AED if available	13. Turn the AED on; Make sure all <b>CLOTHING</b> is removed from chest before attaching <b>PADS</b>
7. Open <b>AIRWAY</b> , tilt <b>HEAD</b> , lift <b>CHIN</b>	12. Continue <b>CPR</b> until AED arrives
8. Put your ear next to victim's <b>MOUTH</b> and nose	11. Give <b>THIRTY</b> Compressions
9. Look <b>LISTEN</b> , and feel for breaths	10. If not breathing normally give <b>TWO</b> breaths

1. Early 911
2. Early CPR
3. Early Defibrillation
4. Early Advance Life Support
